Keeping the words of Jesus

Jesus said to His disciples, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me." (John 14:23-24)

What are Jesus' words that we must keep? When we think of Jesus' words, we may think that these only pertain to the words He spoke that were recorded in the Gospels. However, if we consider that Jesus said that His words are not His but that of the Father who sent Him; then we can begin to understand that Jesus' words also include the word of God in all of scripture. Therefore, Jesus' words are not only His moral teachings and commandments in the Gospels, but also includes the messages of God to the people given through the prophets and the commandments of the Old Testament.


If we love Jesus, then we will keep His words; here, "keeping" means not only knowing, but living by His words. We cannot select and keep only the ones that we like, nor can we interpret Jesus' moral teachings and the commandments in such a way that suits us.



The word of God is the objective truth; it does not change, because "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) Some

people say that the commandments in scripture are not universal; i.e., they don't apply to all peoples in the world, nor do they apply to the world today because the values of the world have changed.

However, Jesus' words, the word of God has not lost its significance, even in today's world.



A man had a massive heart attack and was pronounced clinically dead. His soul separated from his body and he saw all the doctors hovering over his body in the emergency room. In an instant, He was pulled into some place which he reckoned as standing before Jesus for judgment. But Jesus wasn't sitting behind a desk with a gavel. Rather, he saw a white light, not a blinding light that causes pain to the onlooker, but a beautiful light that made him see the

whole truth. Right before his eyes he saw all the things he did in life, good and bad, big and small. Jesus was that light. Even on earth, Jesus was the light that moved sinners from the bottom of their hearts. Just looking at Jesus made them see the truth, the error of their ways, and the love of Christ which compelled them to true repentance.

The man saw Truth itself, the error of his ways, and the great love of Christ for him. He desired nothing more than to return to earth and to change his life. After seven minutes, the man came back to life in the emergency room. He lived to carry out the changes in his life once and for all. He had learned that loving Jesus is not just feeling or saying he loved Jesus, but that loving Jesus meant keeping His words. Lord Jesus, help us to keep your words.
